Your Voices Have Been Heard

Throughout the month of February, the Parish Pastoral Council held several listening sessions in order to understand parishioner perspectives on where the church and our parish are today. We were thrilled to have had more than 300 of you share your thoughts with us. What started as four parish-wide listening sessions and a survey, turned into seven listening sessions, more than 50 detailed survey replies, and various forms of feedback from ministries and individuals. We also held a LGBTQIA+ listening session that was open to the entire DC-area.

As a result of this strong participation, we were able to submit a detailed report back to the Archdiocese of Washington in preparation for the Synod discussions at the Archdiocese level in the coming weeks and months. Given the extensive feedback we received and the specific questions the Archdiocese asked us to address, we shared a condensed version of our report with them. However, we have compiled a full report that is now posted on trinity.org and available for you to view. Direct

quotes and summarized comments make up the core of the report so that we could accurately depict what you told us.

When we looked back at the notes we had from our sessions, we found that many of you shared similar perspectives and insights. As a result, we identified five key themes that resonated for our parish.

- 1. Spirituality is strong as Holy Trinity
- **2.** The Church and fellow Catholics should give vocal support for LGBTQIA+ Catholics
- **3.** Women should have a greater role in the Church
- **4.** Young Catholics are unlikely to return to the Church until it makes fundamental changes
- **5.** The Church is the people, not the hierarchy

Finally, while it was enormously clear that participants believed spirituality is strong at Holy Trinity, there were still concerns about the parish voiced and suggestions made for how to strengthen it for everyone. The report also shares these perspectives in its own section. The feedback that gave suggestions for improvements our parish could make is being examined by the entire Parish Pastoral Council and brought to relevant committees for further consideration. We look forward to updating you in the coming months on progress made on this front.

Thank you again to all who participated in the Synod process at Holy Trinity. Your prayerful participation is both appreciated and valued. We pray that the Synod process continues to be welcoming and reflects a continued willingness to hear from all.

LIVING OUR MISSION

Remembering St. Ignatius and St. Francis Xavier on the 400th Anniversary of Their Canonization

Ignatius of Loyola and Francis Xavier met when they were both students at the University of Paris. They were both born in the Basque region of Spain, the youngest sons of noble families. Francis had already been studying at the university for a few years, and was rooming with Peter Faber, when Ignatius came to share their lodgings. Ignatius had a profound influence on both future saints, but Francis was initially resistant to Ignatius' efforts to invite him to a deeper spiritual life and mission. Finally, Francis was one of six men who joined Ignatius in 1534 to make initial vows and eventually found the Society of Jesus in 1540.

Ignatius and Francis were great friends. Ignatius was initially reluctant to send Francis to Asia in 1541, a mission Francis had volunteered for. The two were never to see each other again, but kept up a lengthy correspondence. Ignatius remained in Rome and oversaw the quickly growing Society. Francis traveled to Goa, India, Southeast Asia, Japan, and China, sharing the Good News and welcoming tens (and possibly hundreds) of thousands into the Church through baptism. Francis died in 1552, on an island off the mainland of China. Ignatius died in 1556 in Rome. They were canonized on March 12, 1622, along with Teresa of Avila, Philip Neri, and Isidore of Madrid.

These two saints have been inspirations and role models for many people, including our parishioners. In their own words:

Sebastian Tong: The widely different ways St. Ignatius and St. Francis lived out their callings - one leading the Jesuits from a desk in Rome and one traveling throughout Asia as a missionary - has inspired me to be open to the ways that God could be calling me to live and witness. Viewing them as examples in my life has challenged me to be open to new experiences and new ways that God may be speaking to me.

Brian Cain: My wife Mary and I named our son Francis Xavier. What I think I want most for my son is to be a person that cares about the world around him. Francis Xavier inspires my wife and I because he engaged with the world and was willing to go to the far reaches of the Earth to share of his faith and of himself. Francis Xavier believed so deeply in the Church that he wanted to share its mission with the entire world. In whatever my son does, I hope to share with him these values of care for the Church and care for the world.

Jan Silvano: For me, St Ignatius's empathy, compassion, and human understanding were extraordinary. The Spiritual Exercises and the concepts of discernment and Ignatian presupposition stand out as his foundational gifts to me and all-personkind. We are blessed!

Liz Hughes: I love the friendship between St. Ignatius and St. Francis Xavier, even when they were separated by significant geographic distances. Their shared companionship reminds me that we walk together with so many -- those we see regularly and those we do not -- who are striving for a more faith-filled, just, and hopeful world.






