Holy Trinity Plants Hundreds of Trees at Holy Rood Cemetery

Since the fall of 2019, Holy Trinity has been heeding Pope Francis' call to "Care for Creation" by planting more than 200 new trees and shrubs at Holy Rood Cemetery, with more to come. The tree planting is part of the parish's Green Team initiative.

Holy Rood, our 6.5-acre parish cemetery established in 1832, is located on a hillside, just north of Georgetown on Wisconsin Ave., N.W. An early photograph of the cemetery shows many large trees and evergreen shrubs dotting the landscape. But as the original plantings aged and died, they were not replaced, and the green canopy all but disappeared.

In the fall of 2019, Holy Trinity made a major investment in renewing some of the landscaping at Holy Rood as part of the parish's columbarium project there. We planted more than 130 trees and evergreen shrubs in the columbarium area

and at the new entrance to the cemetery. We also planted 2,300 Winter Jasmine shrubs on the steep embankment along Wisconsin Ave., and adjacent to the columbarium crypt. These initial plantings dramatically improved the appearance and the environment at Holy Rood, but they only covered a small portion of the cemetery grounds.

In 2020, Holy Trinity and Georgetown University, owner of the cemetery, forged a partnership with Casey Trees to complete relandscaping the cemetery. Casey Trees is a non-profit foundation that Betty Brown Casey established in 2002 to restore, enhance, and protect the tree canopy in the nation's capital. The foundation plants a wide variety of trees free of charge, and waters them during the first year while they are becoming established. To date, Casey Trees has planted more than 25,000 trees in public space and in privately-owned areas throughout the city.

Planting trees at Holy Rood Cemetery is one of Casey Trees special projects. Since the fall of 2020, the foundation has planted 110 trees at Holy Rood, including oaks, maples, flowering trees, and evergreens. The foundation will be planting approximately 70 more trees at Holy Rood in the spring of 2022, with additional plantings in the coming years until the tree canopy at Holy Rood has been fully restored. The next time you visit or drive past Holy Rood, look up and take a moment to give thanks for the trees.

LIVING OUR MISSION

The Superior General of the Society of Jesus has asked Jesuits worldwide to reflect on how we live our vow of poverty. The process of reflection parallels that of the Synod: the Holy Spirit inspires our individual reflections; these reflections are shared in common, then progressively aggregated with further reflections at each level, then sent to our headquarters in Rome. Here are a few of my own reflections.

When we take vows as Jesuits, we pledge to adopt the poverty of Jesus, to be increasingly like him in how we live and love. The generosity of our service manifests his love, especially his love of those most in need.

Our poverty is living in what is - in the present moment with its potentiality but also its limitations. Our affluence enables us to act, when many with far less cannot. Our poverty is to live in their presence, to help where we can, but to recognize our inability to relieve their poverty in any significant way.

Our poverty, articulated by our vow, is liberating and constraining. It is liberating, if we recognize that poverty provides the Spirit the place to work in us in a way that our temptation to self-reliance would otherwise obstruct.

Our poverty can be liberating for those people who find value in us and in our endeavors on their behalf. In our poverty we can see the Spirit at work and so experience gratitude for God's care for the world.

Our poverty is liberating, if we offer ourselves to our provincial to mission us, to send us to places of greatest need. Allowing ourselves to be missioned in obedience as men living chastely and celibately as an act of poverty opens us to the empowering movement of the Spirit and so liberates us from anxieties about optimizing our efforts. These Spirit-enriched, optimized efforts give glory to God, joy to ourselves, and assistance to those around us.

Poverty is liberating, if we Jesuits open ourselves to each other in transparency to build relationships of mutuality, what Ignatius calls the union of hearts and minds.

Conversely, our poverty is constraining, if we hide rather than speak openly. Our personal and communal relationships will suffer and even atrophy, and poverty will become an impediment and a burden.

Our poverty is constraining, as is our vow of celibacy/chastity, in that we are constrained from participating in the family life open to most human beings.

Our poverty is constraining in that it brings us together with people to work or live whom we did not choose, may not like, may not work nor live well with.

But, ultimately, our vows unite us intimately to Jesus, not automatically as a matter of caste, but rather personally and individually as a matter of desire and choice, insofar as we take the vows seriously and accept his invitation to relationship.

Please pray that we will be faithful to our vows, as we pray for you that you will be faithful to your baptismal vows.

All are invited to prepare for Easter and encounter the Lenten scriptures in a way St. Ignatius introduces us to in the Spiritual Exercises. During the hour, savor






