"Can I really do nothing?" By Tania Chomiak-Salvi

The time we are living through will have a label in history books. Life has been slow-moving dread: a global pandemic that stopped everything, a response that divided people more often than it united us. And now an attack that rocks our international system: a large nation in Europe (yes, it is on the European continent) attacks a peaceful, sovereign neighbor. We feel the dread, we hear the confusion of fleeing refugees, we see civilian objects destroyed, we marvel at the courage.

Ukraine has known challenge throughout its history. Many ethnicities and many faiths have their roots in that region, and many of us have historical memory – good and bad – from what is today Ukraine. Modern Ukraine is open and thriving and is home to many faiths. The priest you see blessing troops might be Orthodox or Ukrainian Catholic. The Ukrainians praying, singing praise or blessing each other might be Pentecostals, Mormons, Jews. Ukraine's Crimean Tatars are a Muslim community. Ukraine is a democracy in more than just politics. A free country of many faiths, heritages, and languages has been attacked.

Together with my family and friends with roots in Ukraine, I

have been spending days of dread. While we can, we reach out to our relatives in Ukraine. My mother talks to her cousins in Ukraine daily. They remember their own refugee flight: west, to the U.S. or Canada; or east, to 40 years of Soviet rule. During the past 30 years of Ukraine's independence, the cousins – not history – decided where they lived, where their children grew up, where they worked. During those 30 years, those children – my second cousins and I – established our own relationships. Today, we watch for familiar scenes in the images of Ukraine. "Is that the building where our apartment is located?" "Is that near Orysia's house?"

It is absurd, it feels surreal, but it's happening. What can we do? I pray. Writing this is the most I have spoken about this situation, because I am in such disbelief. I was planning to spend the month of June in Kyiv, sorting my late father's remaining belongings in the apartment where my parents spent their summers. Now I realize how easily those belongings might be incinerated. Can I really do nothing?

At long last, I learn how praying is actually doing something. In the silence of prayer, in ceasing physical activity and giving space to interior activity, I try to discern hope out of the despair. Hope is what I am doing. In this world, in this time, hope is a heavy lift. I'm working on it.

LIVING OUR MISSION

Silence and Simplicity

Lent. In thinking about accompanying one another in Christ through this Lenten season, I began thinking of the ways we can make that happen and how that would look, feel and sound. Obviously, in churchwhere we gather as the Body of Christ each Sunday.

How will that look? When you enter the Church this Lent you are immediately struck by the simplicity of the space. The live, green plants are gone, and you see bare branches. A deep purple cloth swaddles the arms of the large, plain wooden cross. The beautiful lighted cross is covered in plain burlap. The cantor says, "Before we begin, let us take a moment in silence to recall the joys and sorrows we bring to this liturgy. Together, with the bread and wine, we place them on the altarin repentance, in hope, in gratitude." We sit in silence. We recall joys and, in these days, we have many sorrows to reflect on.

Silence. We are not always comfortable with silence. Our first thought might be, 'who forgot their cue!' But let us be still at this time, considering our past week and what those joys and sorrows are. They probably won't be the same each week.

Then the music begins simply. A stark chord. The cantor chants, "Hold us in your mercy," and we repeat that phrase. The cantor chants again, "Hold us in your mercy" and we repeat. The cantor will sing verses throughout the procession and our response to each line will be those two opening chants, "Hold us in your mercy." After the simple greeting from the presider the cantor will chant our penitential act, "Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison, Kyrie eleison" and we will respond accordingly. We ask for mercy, for healing, for forgiveness.

When we offer the Prayers of the Faithful, our response will be "Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer." Simplicity. Our Eucharistic Acclamations are a simple chant, "Missa Simplex," the chant we sang during Advent. Within a couple of weeks this chant will be sung simply, without accompaniment. We will be sent forth each week with the Taizé chant, "Jesus, remember me," the message of the thief at Jesus' side at his crucifixion. We, too, ask to be remembered.

Our music will reflect the journey of the Lord as he and his disciples make their way to Jerusalem. We wait for the procession through the streets with our palms on Palm Sunday when we sing "Jerusalem, my destiny."

So, our journey each Sunday this Lent will provide us the opportunity to gather as the Body of Christ and steep ourselves in this season of prayer, almsgiving, and fasting. I encourage everyone to become more focused on texts and praying them more slowly; focusing on the words. I look forward to our Lenten journey to the Cross. See you on the way...






