Many Opportunities for Worship

As we enter Holy Week and the Triduum and Resurrection of our Lord, we take part in the powerful liturgies of our high holy days. Most are indoors, two are outdoors, and two will be livestreamed. It is worth noting that this is our first “normal” Holy Week and Easter in two years, thanks to COVID-19. But no matter your current COVID comfort level (masks are optional for those fully vaccinated and boosted) or geographic location, all are welcome and encouraged to be a part of the Triduum and Easter liturgies.

Palm Sunday, April 9-10, begins in Trinity Hall (except the Sunday 7:30am Mass) with the blessing of palms, the reading of Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem and a procession to the Church with palms and singing. The 9am Mass will be live-streamed, as usual.

On Wednesday, April 13, the Parish Reconciliation service begins at 7pm in the Church. There will be no Reconciliation on Holy Saturday afternoon.

Then, on Thursday, April 14, at 9am Morning Prayer will be celebrated in the Church. Lent quietly ends at sundown. At

8pm the Evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper is celebrated. All are invited to have their feet washed. After the reception of Communion, all process to Trinity Hall singing “Stay with Me” for the Transfer of the Holy Eucharist and Benediction.

Morning Prayer on Good Friday, 15 April, begins at 9am in the Church. At noon, on Zoom, Spiritual Director Linda Arnold and Art Historian Nora Heimann guide a Good Friday prayer through art and poetry. Stations of the Cross will take place at 4pm in the Church, after which there will be an opportunity to venerate the Cross. At 8pm the Commemoration of the Lord’s Passion is celebrated. There will be both Communal and Individual Veneration of the Cross.

April 16, Holy Saturday begins at 9am with Morning Prayer and a final Preparation Rite for the Elect who will be baptized at the Great Easter Vigil that night. At noon there will be a Holy Saturday service at Holy Rood Cemetery. At 8:00pm the Great Easter Vigil begins outdoors in the courtyard with the Preparation and Lighting of the Paschal Candle and the Procession and Sharing of Light as all process to the Church. During the Exultet and the Liturgy of the Word we hear the stories of our history. Our seven Elect receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Our neophytes help us renew our Baptismal promises and reaffirm our own Confirmation. We rejoice and welcome them into the Catholic Church!

On Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord six masses will be celebrated. The first, at 7:30am, will take place in the Church. There will be two masses celebrated at 9:30am - in Church and in Trinity Hall. A special outdoor mass will be held at 10am at Holy Rood Cemetery (Make sure to bring a folding chair). Then our final masses for Easter Sunday will be celebrated at 11:30am in both the Church and Trinity Hall. The 11:30am Mass in the Church will be live-streamed. Please check the Holy Trinity website for links to the Youtube livestream channel. They will be located on the public calendar on our homepage. ✚

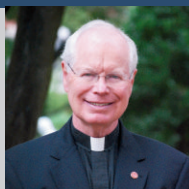

FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK

Pilgrimages have been central rituals to our Jewish-Christian heritage. Certainly the pilgrimage process is evident these coming weeks as our Jewish brothers and sisters prepare for their annual Passover and as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter. In so many ways pilgrimages have served as a means for a faith community to look backward so as to look forward.

Over the past two weeks I have had the opportunity to participate in two pilgrimages. As many of you know, 22 parishioners and myself, after being blessed and missioned at the 11:30 Sunday Mass on March 20, set out on a 10-day pilgrimage to Ignatian sites in Spain and Rome. Our journey was one way by which we participated in the Ignatian Year (May 21, 2021-July 31, 2022), which commemorates the 500th Anniversary of the conversion of the Spaniard Hidalgo Inigo into Ignatius of Loyola, the spiritual pilgrim. Preparation for this pilgrimage began this past January when we gathered via zoom to discuss travel details as well as begin to prepare prayerfully through readings and reflections. As a result, when we landed in Bilbao, Spain and were met by our guide from Illume Travel, we were ready to enter into a process whereby we observed and reflectively shared some of the central sites in the life of Ignatius, who in his autobiography identified himself simply as “the Pilgrim”. Every day we shared The Eucharist at one of the Ignatian sites. These included: The room at Loyola castle where Inigo restarted his religious conversion; the cave at Manresa where he experienced profound graces which inspired his Spiritual Exercises; and the room at the Church of the Gesu in Rome where he died. In addition, we had Mass in the castle where Francis Xavier was born and spent his youth before meeting Ignatius in Paris.

Certainly one of the pilgrimage highlights was seeing the Pope deliver his Sunday noonday prayer and having Mass beneath the main altar at St. Peter’s Basilica near a box containing the remains of St. Peter.

A few days after returning back to the Parish, I participated in another pilgrimage. This past Saturday, as part of the Ignatian Year, the Parish sponsored a program titled, “A Pilgrimage to Remember Our Forgotten Black Parishioners.” The gathering of some 50 participants from Holy Trinity and several other parishes began at Holy Rood Cemetery and then made stops at the former homes of Black parishioners, before engaging in several meditations in the main Church. The program concluded with discussion and lunch in Trinity Hall. The pilgrimage featured talks by Peter Albert and Bernie Cook, parishioners who are professional historians. Another parishioner, Paul Maco offered a sobering legal case involving our first pastor, Fr. Francis Neal. Sadly and shockingly it was revealed that a woman named Pricilla Queen sued for her freedom from Fr. Neal, but was legally deprived. A summary of the case may be found on our website. One of the takeaways of this pilgrimage was the statement expressed by a descendant of one of our Black parishioners who noted, “Thank you for acknowledging our stories.”

Each pilgrimage prepared the participants for Holy Week, for as we “look backward so as to look forward” we acknowledge the graces and the sins of our past. By doing so we learn more experientially “to see all things new in Christ.”

DAILY MASS INTENTIONS

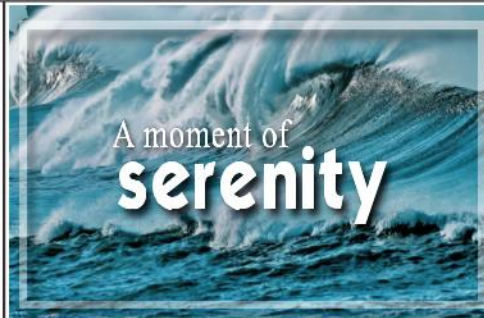

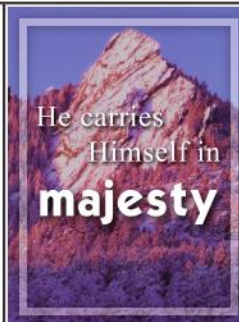
