Easter Reflection: Caravaggio's Supper at Emmaus by Fr. Kevin Gillespie, SJ

Some years ago, I attended a lecture by noted art historian Michael Fried of Princeton University, a specialist in 16th Century Baroque artist Caravaggio who is known for shocking audiences with his vivid and rather provocative biblical scenes. The Italian artist had a particular way of capturing a sudden and significant moment in the characters he painted. One such example is the painting to the right. It is titled, Supper at Emmaus (c. 1601, The National Gallery, London)

In this Easter story, Luke tells us of Cleopas and his companion walking away from Jerusalem, desolate and distraught about what had occurred to the one who they had thought would redeem Israel, Jesus the Nazarene. Then a traveler approaches and asks them what they were discussing. The traveler listens intently and proceeds to offer to them a wider perspective. The next scene has the traveler eating supper with the two companions when suddenly his face takes on a different appearance and the traveler is revealed as the risen Jesus.

There are two features to this story worth noting. One is found in the phrase, "Cleopas and his friend." It's curious the name of Cleopas's friend is not mentioned. Some scripture scholars suggest the friend was a woman and perhaps the wife of Cleopas. So why was she not named? Perhaps it was because a woman's testimony in the ancient Near East was often suspected, and so Luke did not want to diminish this witness's account.

Prof. Fried suggests another dimension to the story: in Supper at Emmaus Caravaggio depicts the traveler as female, and that is why the two companions did not recognize Jesus. At supper, as the traveler breaks and blesses the bread, the feminine face, almost like a mask, suddenly becomes revealed as the face of the man, Jesus. This interpretation by Caravaggio and Professor Fried is not based on scripture mind you, but as this noted



art historian argued, if one looks closely at the way in which Caravaggio portrayed the face of Jesus it is a bit feminine. For Fried, Caravaggio wants us to see how a feminine face is suddenly being transformed then and there into a masculine one. At the lecture Prof. Fried went on to suggest to our rapt audience that this sudden transformative moment is typical of Caravaggio's style, noting we see something similar in The Calling of St. Matthew (c. 1599-1600 San Luigi dei Francesi, Rome) and Conversion of St. Paul on the Way to Damascus (c. 1601, Basilica Parrocchiale Santa Maria del Popolo.)

Theologically, the message one can take away from this painting is that Christ comes to us as male and female. And just as John and then Peter arrived at Jesus' tomb on Easter morning, shocked to find it empty, so too does Caravaggio's depiction of the Supper at Emmaus shock us. Perhaps one of the graces of this Ignatian Year is to allow ourselves to be shocked, so that we may learn to see "all things new in Christ."



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

There is something very sacred about visiting a cemetery. Whether participating in a burial service or simply visiting the grave of a friend or a relative, being present at the grave of someone we knew allows us to ponder the deeper meanings of their lives and our own. In recent years it has become commonplace for our parishioners to visit the graves or niches of loved ones at our Holy Rood Cemetery. During Holy Week I have had the pleasure of serving dozens of parishioners attending Holy Saturday noon service there and/or the 10am Easter Sunday liturgy. On these sacred grounds where more than 7,000 of our parishioners have, since 1832, been buried, and where, since 2019, dozens have been inurned, our shared prayers seem to become more alive!

The practices and rituals associated with the death of Jesus during Holy Week serve as ways to acknowledge the death of loved one as well as our own future death. And when the death of a loved one occurs during the Easter Season, we may especially find consolation in our faith in the Resurrected Christ. Such a death happened for my family and me when my father passed away on Easter Monday, 1980. While it was a tremendous loss, we found great consolation in the readings of Resurrection and the Easter graces of hymnals and rituals. The Easter graces continue when I visit his and my mother's grave at a cemetery outside of Philadelphia.

This Easter I find a similar experience of consolation as my fellow Jesuits and I grieve the recent death of a member of our Jesuit community, Fr. Drew Christiansen, SJ. A former editor of *America Magazine* and a prolific writer, Drew served as an advisor to Catholic bishops and leaders, including the papal nuncio and Pope Francis.

Fr. Christiansen's funeral has been scheduled to take place here at Holy Trinity on the Wednesday after Easter, April 20, and he will be buried at the Jesuit cemetery located in the heart of Georgetown University's campus. In the near future when I visit Drew's grave, surrounded by hundreds of my Jesuit brothers, I will give thanks for their lives as well as for the great gift of faith which allows us to believe that one day we will join them in the Resurrected Body of Jesus The Christ.
