In These Days of Lenten Journey by Dr. Kathleen DeJardin

We are halfway through our Lenten journey to the Cross and Resurrection. We have begun our Masses with silent reflection, added some prayerful silence into the Prayers of the Faithful. We have sung songs of mercy and of the cross. Our Eucharistic Acclamations are now sung without accompaniment as we begin to focus even more intently on our journey to the Triduum.

Our Elect-Patrick, Anina, Ronald, Carolyn, Mihwa, Tristin and Frank are completing their Rite of Christian Initiation program, as they journey to the Easter Vigil to become new members of the Catholic Church. We have been prayerfully supporting them over these past years and look forward to rejoicing with them at the Great Vigil.

There are few opportunities for outdoor assembly processions throughout the church year, but we have three processions to join on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil. Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. We begin Masses in Trinity Hall where our palms are blessed; we hear the proclamation of Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem and process to the Church singing "Jerusalem, my destiny!"

After the final days of Lent have passed we celebrate Morning Prayer Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 9am in the Church. The Triduum is one continuous liturgy over three nights. Thursday evening we celebrate Holy Thursday of the Lord's Supper and receive the Holy Oils, blessed by Cardinal Gregory at the Chrism Mass, have our feet washed, and process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose in Trinity Hall. The evening ends in silence.

Good Friday afternoon at 4pm we celebrate the Stations of the Cross. The 8pm Good Friday Evening of the Lord's Passion begins in silence. We communally venerate the Cross, receive the Body of Christ and conclude the service in silence. There

is an opportunity for individual veneration and quiet prayer. As we have just experienced the Crucifixion of Jesus, Holy Saturday morning begins quietly with Morning Prayer and a final Rite for the Elect, Ephphetha, where their mouth and ears are opened. The Great Easter Vigil begins outside in the courtyard with the Blessing of the Fire and the Preparation of the Paschal Candle. Fr. Kevin will trace the year on the candle and will insert five nails into the candle. He then lights the

LIVING OUR MISSION

My first day as your new communications director was February 14 – the Feast of St. Valentine. As I settled into my new desk to turn on my computer I heard school children outside my window. "Red Light! ... Green Light!" "I'm going to like it here," I thought. The sound of kids playing put me at ease – familiar sounds after many years of being a stayat-home mom.

In a previous life I worked on Capitol Hill, and shortly after that I served as Director of Communications for a trade association. I took a step away from full time office work in 2015 after my oldest daughter (age three at the time) was diagnosed with a rare brain and spinal cord condition that I often describe as being similar to childhood Multiple Sclerosis (MS). Her diagnosis is also what led me to the Catholic faith. Today she is 13, and thankfully attending school and doing quite well.

It was in the Catholic Church that I was introduced to the idea that it's okay to ask God for miracles; to resign myself to God's will; and to accept that ultimately, He has a plan for me that is better than anything I could hope for. Of course, like everyone, I struggle with these ideas at times. But the great thing about the Catholic faith is, it is okay to fail, and you are encouraged to keep trying.

Although my family and I live in Arlington, we have been fortunate to attend mass at Holy Trinity several times. In October of last year, I watched as my nephew received First Holy Communion here. The year before, I was honored to stand beside my niece as she was Confirmed. Each time I attend mass at Holy Trinity, I feel a sense of love, peace and acceptance that very few parishes, very few places, provide.

And just like the masses, parishioners and staff at Holy Trinity have been so kind and welcoming during my first few weeks of work. Everyone asks, "How's it going? Like drinking from a firehose?" I always answer by saying, "It's going well. There's a lot going on here!" Never have I seen a parish with so many wonderful programs, and so many opportunities to connect with one another and with God. There is much to communicate about and many people to communicate with.

Holy Trinity is alive. It is alive with the sound of children. It is alive with beautiful music. It is alive with active and engaged parishioners who seek to "Accompany One Another in Christ, Celebrate God's Love and Transform Lives."

candle directly from the fire. After sharing the light with all present, the procession moves to the darkened Church. After the Paschal Candle is placed in the stand, the Exultet is sung by the lights of our candles.

After the Liturgy of the Word the Elect process around the Church to the Baptismal font as the Litany of the Saints is sung. They are Baptized, Confirmed and receive Eucharist. We are once again able to sing our joy-filled Alleluias and with organ, string quartet, trumpet, bassoon, Triduum Choir and the Body of Christ present, we sing "We shall rise again!" I hope that many of you will be a part of this most holy time in our Church year. This is who we are - an Easter people!.




