Living in God's Love by Martina O'Shea

In preparation for their May 1st Confirmation, 100+ middle and high school students engaged in a week-long Ignatian retreat in daily life. The intention of the retreat was to invite the candidates to slow down each day, quiet their bodies and minds, and be introduced to ways of praying drawn from St. Ignatius Loyola. Our hope was that the prayer tools that have helped thousands of individuals for 450+ years, might be a resource for these teens as they walk into adulthood.

Following an opening session either on zoom or in person, the candidates were asked to carve out 20 minutes to pray. Each day they were invited to recall that they were in God's presence – a presence of loving kindness and peace. Each day

they asked for a grace – something they needed and that they could not give themselves.

Asking to be surprised at God's creation began the week. They prayed with Psalm 104 and considered bringing to mind something in God's creation, e.g., a tennis racket or a catcher's mitt that reminded them of their friends, or their pet dog or cat, or the talents God has given them.

They asked for the grace to accept that they are precious to God. They imagined God saying these words from the prophet Isaiah to them: "You are precious in my eyes and I love you." [Is 43: 4]

They asked for the grace to be Jesus' friend. And prayed with the Lucan passage when Jesus looks at Zacchaeus in the sycamore tree and says, "I want to come to your house today." They were invited to use their imagination and hear Jesus say those words to them.

Mary Oliver's poem, "The Place I Want to Get Back To," invited them to reflect on what they are grateful for. The retreat closed with being led through an adapted Examen of the retreat.

Sponsors met with their candidate midway through the retreat. Sponsors and the candidates' parents had this to say:

"The retreat booklet was very helpful."

"I thought the retreat was a very helpful experience for my son. Just having the daily time and using his [retreat booklet] to write out his answers helped him to become more contemplative about a lot of things! I loved talking to him about his reflections."

"What a wonderful tool for young teens."

One candidate completed the retreat with the comment:

"This was a great experience. I learned a lot from the Examen prayer and I will keep looking out for Jesus in my daily life."

LIVING OUR MISSION

In most parts of the northern hemisphere May is the height of spring. A beautiful time of year when flowers are at peak bloom, the weather is neither too hot nor too cold, and the days are getting longer. The return of color, light and warmth to the natural world fills us with a sense of hope and renewal. I have always thought that May is the perfect month! How fitting that May is also the Month of Mary, our perfect Mother in Heaven.

But how and where did this linking of spring and Mother Mary start? Not surprisingly the connection between believers finding pleasure in the natural world and becoming devoted to our Blessed Mother is no coincidence. According to an article in *Salt + Light Media*, “The tradition of dedicating the month of May to Mary, came about in the 13th century. Some say...it was created to replace various pagan cults. The actual reason is the fact that this month is the time when spring is at the height of its beauty. Spring is also connected with nature renewing itself. In her way, Mary gave new life to the world when she gave birth to our savior Jesus Christ. The link between Mary and the month of May became popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it had a firm hold among their students at the Roman College and a short time later it was publicly celebrated in the Gesù Church in Rome. From there it spread to the rest of the Church.”

In some countries during May, statues of the Blessed Virgin are crowned with a garland of flowers recognizing her as a perfect follower of Christ, the “crown” of creation, and the Mother of the Son of God...the messianic King.

Linking Mary to spring and celebrating her in May festivals might give the impression that Mary never struggled a day in her life. But her life was full of challenges (saying yes to God at the Annunciation); struggle (bearing a child in poverty at the Nativity); and heartache (standing with the beloved disciple at the Crucifixion). Mary is our perfect Mother and Queen not because she lived a perfectly charmed life like a modern-day Kardashian, but because she remained faithful to God, to her Son and to her mission in this imperfect and hostile world. She shows us how to be faithful, loving, and nurturing in the face of risk and challenge. As a mother of two teenage girls (one with special needs) I can tell you, “The struggle is real, folks!” Mary’s struggles as a mother here on earth make her the perfect advocate for us in heaven.

So, this month I invite you to join me in making an extra effort to pray to our beautiful Mother Mary in Heaven. And let’s also take time to honor and appreciate all the mothers in our lives who strive to care, comfort and advocate for those around them. Whether you are a mom of children, a mom to your “fur babies,” or a person (man or woman) whose nurturing spirit brings peace and comfort to friends and strangers—Happy Mother’s Day to you!

I like to believe we are all called to be mothering at some point – to care lovingly for one another – and to live out our mission of accompanying one another in Christ, celebrating God’s love and transforming lives. How lucky we are God gave us Mary as our guide and example!

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL (PPC)

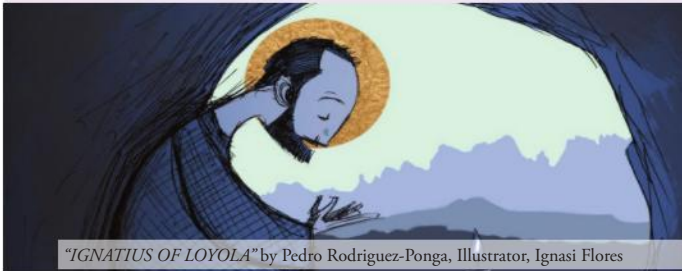

May Fundraiser for Haitian Mothers

The St. Jean Baptiste Committee is working on a new initiative to provide clean delivery birth kits and newborn kits to women in Haiti. A key element lacking in the birthing process for the women of Haiti is a clean, safe delivery. In addition to the clean delivery birth kits, the committee will be putting together newborn kits too. The collection will run from **May 8 - May 29**. Requested items for the newborn kits include: diaper pins, newborn cloth diapers, bars of soap, diaper covers, three-month size t-shirts (snap), and swaddling blankets. Individual items may be dropped off in collection baskets at Mass, at the parish center or shipped to the Parish Center, Attn: Social Justice. The committee is also accepting donations to purchase items. It costs approximately \$15 for a newborn kit and \$25 for a clean delivery kit. 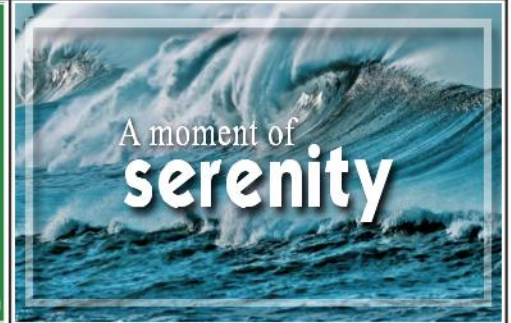

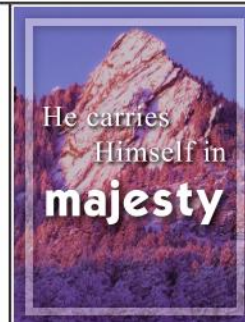

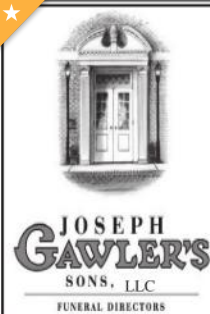
