Listening and Speaking on the Way to the Synod

"We have to help people empty their buckets," said one of the Sisters who sat with us as we worked through the questions. "That's when God comes through to deify us."

The Archdiocesan of Washington (ADW) Synod Listening Session for the DC parishes took place on May 14 at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, an historically Black Catholic parish in Southeast DC. With reports from Holy Trinity's parishlevel listening sessions, two Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) members and our pastor, Fr. Kevin Gillespie, joined over 80 priests, religious, and laypeople, to accompany one another on the path to the Synod on Synodality called by Pope Francis.

Other parishes and communities raised themes that echoed many of those expressed by Holy Trinity parishioners. Throughout the session, people brought up their positive experiences engaging with the Mass and with the community. They shared concerns about the continued marginalization of the LGBTQIA+ community, people of color, and women. They shared a need to raise young people to the status of leaders and to help people become engaged with faith formation. They were heartened by Pope Francis' efforts to consult the universal Church--not just the institutional hierarchy--but shared concerns about transparency and whether the bishops would truly engage with the process, particularly as the reports are further consolidated on the way to Rome.

In other cases, participants from other parishes emphasized points that did not arise or arose infrequently in Holy Trinity's sessions. Examples included the sense that increased use of technology had left some parishioners feeling more alienated, rather than more connected, and one parish advocating for the continued celebration of the Traditional Latin Mass in their parish and others that offer that rite.

This summer, the ADW will consolidate the results of 106 parish reports, all four archdiocesan listening sessions, and

1000 online comments into a single 10-page report. That full report will be published in both English and Spanish on ADW's website and in the *Catholic Standard*. At the national level, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) will similarly condense 196 diocesan reports into a single, 10-page consensus document. A subsequent continental phase will consolidate the USCCB's report with inputs from other North American and Caribbean conferences in a report that informs the synod in Rome. Pope Francis has committed that women and men religious and laypersons will participate at every level, including that October 21-23, 2023 meeting at the Vatican.

At the concluding Mass, Cardinal Gregory exhorted us to, "Love one another," a particularly poignant mandate on the day of the racist mass shooting in Buffalo, NY, and amidst ongoing atrocities in the war in Ukraine and now the tragedy in Texas. Through it all, he emphasized that we need to love everyone.

Listening is one step--if only the first step--to love. May we continue taking steps forward.

LIVING OUR MISSION

"We may have to do this learning from home for two whole weeks." Those were the words I wrote to our Holy Trinity School community on March 12, 2020. How innocent we were!

The distance learning did continue through that spring and in October of 2020 we started bringing the kids to school multiple days each week in compliance with spacing requirements. By spring of 2021, our youngest learners were in school every day and our oldest three days each week.

This year, we have been in school just about every day. Our students seem to be about where they would normally be academically. Through service activities like making sandwiches for the McKenna Center we have been able to keep service to others going strong. We have had many online masses and prayer services, complete with Communion traveling around the buildings after mass or "drive thru" ashes. We have added a "Wellness" class to our curriculum to help all of us process these last few years and especially to recognize how to find social and emotional help when we need it. For all of these successes, we have many people to thank.

Our students have been resilient, determined and joyful. Despite being apart at times, the kids have learned together, played together, and prayed together. We are very proud of our current 8th graders, who will graduate on June 3, and then matriculate to many of the finest high schools in the city. Despite the difficult conditions, they posted our highest scores on the High School Placement Test in four years. And, while they have been leaders and role models in many ways, we teachers did defeat them in the Student-Faculty Basketball Game!

Our HTS teachers are, quite simply, the best. While many schools took time off to figure out distance learning in March of 2020, our teachers dove in over that first weekend and left no stone unturned in engaging and helping their students. Many teachers were going (and continue to go) the extra mile: 1-on-1 zoom meetings, leading virtual clubs, or conducting porch visits with students.

Our school parents have generously supported their students and the school. Whether it was providing lunches, stocking our staff lounges, contributing to home office upgrades, or most importantly collaborating with teachers to keep students growing, our parents have been great partners in success over the last two years. As the President of our Home-School Association put it, "We are all here because this is a great place, and this is a great place because we are all here."

Above all, we give thanks to God. Whether in moments of consolation or desolation, we have kept God at the center with daily prayer and thanksgiving for our many blessings. Always at HTS, we try to remember that love matters most!




