HTS Back to School

Holy Trinity School welcomed 334 students for the first day of classes on Monday, August 29. From our humble beginning in 1818 on the 2nd floor of the St. Ignatius Chapel to our dynamic modern program, we strive to live our mission each day: promotion of justice, service of faith, and pursuit of academic excellence.

The year has begun with tremendous excitement as we are operating without any modifications due to COVID. We are able to gather as a whole school community for masses and assemblies. We have also exited the pandemic restrictions stronger than ever with a dynamic house system (like Hogwarts), an innovative reading program, a beefed up Spanish program, and a modern mathematics curriculum. One can see our house logos throughout the school buildings. Each of our houses (Romero, Arrupe, Becraft, Xavier, Day, and Juana), has a trait that its members encourage in the school (courage, perseverance, humility, gratitude, justice, and compassion).

One of the signature programs at HTS for over thirty years has been our Holly Destry Scholars Program (formerly known as the Gavigan Program) that supports students with potential who need some support to get up to speed with the rigorous academic program at HTS, high school, and beyond. The program has changed many lives for the better. These students receive full tuition scholarships, 1-on-1 tutoring after school, and a month of summer academic enrichment. As we embark on this school year, we are so grateful to be a ministry of the Parish and glad we can contribute to the life of this vibrant faith community. We reach out regularly to

ACCOMPANY ONE ANOTHER IN CHRIST

U.N. Secretary-General Antonio Guterres recently stated that, in Ukraine, "we are facing the highest number of violent conflicts since 1945," and concluded that "as always, the poorest and most vulnerable pay the highest price." With the rapid rise of violence and extreme poverty in nations across the world, no wonder that the Holy Father paid special attention again to the victims of those unnecessary wars and injustices as they flee every day to safeguard their God given-lives.

On the occasion of the 108th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, His Holiness Pope Francis reflected upon Hebrews 13:14 "Here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come." His Holiness emphasizes the fact that the future which is the city yet to come must include everyone. He maintains that God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to migrants and refugees, the displaced, and victims of trafficking. The Pope concluded that "the inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's kingdom."

The Pope, in his annual message, expresses apologies to "those living on the existential peripheries." At the same time, he also clearly envisions that the vulnerable, along with the privileged and powerful, have a responsibility and a role in building God's kingdom. He invites the people of the world to unite "together with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees" in this holy effort. We all have a role to play.

In reflecting on the Pope's theme, I cannot help but reflect on my life as a migrant currently living in the U.S. and evaluate my contribution in building the kingdom of God in the ways that I can.

Because of the dreadful social injustice and political unrest in my home country, which I personally experienced, I had to suddenly flee. My dreams to become a university teacher, to help my siblings become who they want to be, and to take care of my aging and struggling parents soon became a mystery and a mirage to me. From Cameroon through almost nine countries between Latin and Central America to the U.S, I was in a constant quest for inclusion and safety.

My journey lasted for about 3 years and seemed so long and was so difficult that I almost took away my life. During my journey, I felt the reality of the Israelites on their passage to the promised land. Except, that for me, I often felt that I was moving alone. The hardships, violence and obstacles that I experienced along my 3-year ordeal led me to feel despair and isolation. And still, deep down, I tried to remember that I was with God, and that God was preparing me to embrace the life that was in store.

When I arrived in the U.S, I met a new family and they accepted and loved me as one of theirs. In fact, God reunited me with my family, my family in faith. Ultimately, the Holy Trinity Migrant Team helped me understand that though our dreams are big, our hopes high, our goals long term, and the path difficult, the only failure is not to believe in God and not to try. For the first time after five years of frequent hopelessness, I hope again.

The good news: I married my beautiful wife this past summer. I have a job. I help deliver food to other migrants. I believe that I will one day become a university lecturer. Bless the Lord oh my soul!




