I was recently reminded how the Universal Apostolic Preferences – the uniting "points of reference" guiding the ministry of the Jesuits – resonate with our own parish's mission statement: We are a Jesuit parish that welcomes all to: Accompany One Another in Christ, Celebrate God's Love and Transform Lives.

Imagine, for example, any of the Preferences being possible without the ministry of Accompaniment. "Showing the Way to God" appears first on the Jesuit's website for the Preferences (www.jesuits. global/uap/). Accompanying another on their spiritual journey is fundamental to the ministry of spiritual friendship and guidance. Our own Ignatian Spirituality ministries are expressions of how we live into this Preference and fulfill our mission to Accompany One Another in Christ.

"Walking with the Excluded" is the next Preference listed. Who, upon reading this, would not immediately think of the plethora of ways we Accompany those who have been marginalized, those who are in need, through our Social Justice efforts?


The Jesuits then list, "Journeying with Youth." We've been so blessed to welcome Katie Laskey as our new youth minister! And we are equally blessed to have such a robust array of youth formation opportunities, from our school, to our Religious Education (with a current enrollment nearing 500!), to Shepherd's Flock, and our sacramental preparation programs.

"Caring for [the Earth] Our Common Home" is the final Preference. It reminds us, as does the work of our Green Team, that we can only Accompany One Another within the context of living harmoniously within the natural order. All our work - and indeed our very survival - depends on our ability to accompany nature.

Our Pledge season this year focuses on the ways we Accompany one another in Christ. We will be reflecting on how we journey with each other in our faith community, and on how we as a parish accompany our fellow human beings.

And we will be reminded that, especially in times of stress and need,

### **LIVING OUR MISSION**

Preparing a Funeral Mass

During the month of November, it is the custom of Catholics to remember our loved ones who have died. This might also be a good time to reflect on preparing a Funeral Mass. If you agree, here are few things to consider.

### Think Sunday

Every Sunday when we gather, we celebrate a "little Easter." What that means is that regardless of the liturgical season, we celebrate the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Isn't that the essence of a Funeral Mass? Jesus is risen from the dead so that we might also share in eternal life! What a comforting thought. So, when preparing a Funeral Mass for a loved one, look to how we celebrate Sunday Mass each week as the model. Be sure to strive for a noble and simple celebration. Simple doesn't mean unimportant or unprepared. Simple means to stay away from any unnecessary words or actions. Simple defers to the Holy Spirit to move hearts and to comfort those who mourn. While we certainly comfort one another, keep in mind that it is Christ himself who is present at this Funeral Mass and Christ is comforting all who mourn when the scripture is proclaimed, when we speak and sing our prayer together, through the ministry of the Priest Celebrant and most uniquely in the Eucharistic elements of bread and wine that we receive.

### Choosing Scripture and Music

When considering which scripture or music to include during the Mass, reflect upon the life of the loved one. Are there common themes that come to mind when you think of the deceased's Christian life? Perhaps there is a word that can summarize their way of living? After your reflection, take a look at some suggested scripture and music for funerals that you will find on the Holy Trinity website at: https://trinity.org/funerals/. You don't need to start from scratch. You are invited to consult with someone from the Holy Trinity Liturgy Team. Check the website for our contact information.

### Honoring the Body

The body of a deceased Catholic Christian is also the body once washed in baptism, anointed with the oil of salvation, and fed with the Bread of Life.

(from the Order of Christian Funerals)

Many are now choosing the option of cremation. When that option is chosen, consider honoring the body by its presence at the Funeral Mass with the cremation and the internment taking place after the Mass. Sometimes, when that's not possible, the cremated remains of the body could be carried in procession by family members.

### Remembering

We honor our loved one by sharing stories. The stories also bring comfort to the mourners. It's for that reason that ample time be set aside outside of the Funeral Mass for storytelling. This is best done at the funeral home during a wake service or after the Funeral Mass at a reception. Consider honoring your loved one by intentionally setting aside an ample amount of time and an appropriate place for remembering.






