Remembering the Jesuit Martyrs of El Salvador by Elisa Montalvo

We called him Nacho.

I was blessed to have Dr. Ignacio Martín-Baró, S.J., as a professor when I was a student at the UCA, the Jesuit university in El Salvador. He taught me three different subjects. He was my boss when I worked at the university as a teaching assistant, and he was also my thesis advisor. Most of all, Nacho was my mentor and my friend. When I moved with my family to the United States in 1983, we continued our friendship. The last time I saw him was in the spring of 1989 when he and Dr. Segundo Montes, S.J. visited us at our home in Miami on their way to a conference.

Throughout the years, Nacho shared with me the threats he and his fellow Jesuits were receiving. I always told him they were safe. I really thought they were, because I could not imagine they would be harmed after the international uproar for the assassination of Monseñor Romero and the four American women religious in 1980. I was wrong. It did happen. Nacho, Segundo, Ellacuría, three other Jesuit priests,

their housekeeper, and her daughter were murdered at their home by the Salvadoran armed forces, in the middle of the night, on November 16, 1989.

33 years later, El Salvador continues to struggle as a nation, and the UCA continues to be a prophetic voice in the political discourse. Did Nacho and others that chose to be the voice of the voiceless die in vain? By no means. They impacted the lives of many that do not give up, that continue to seek justice during their journey on planet earth. I learned from Nacho to strive for congruence between my faith, my heart, my brain, and my deeds. Also, to develop the necessary skills to put my gifts and talents at the service of the most vulnerable. I learned that good intentions are not enough. I am definitely not unique. There are many people that continue to make a difference in their daily toiling, influenced by the education they received at the UCA.

On November 16th, let us each take the time to reflect on who are the most vulnerable among us, and what we may do to make a positive impact in their lives. A deed at a time!

LIVING OUR MISSION

Dear Friends,

I am very grateful for the opportunity to join you in discussing the Mission of our Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) following the 9:00 a.m. Masses on Nov. 20. I have been serving with our JRS in the Kakuma refugee camp in northwestern Kenya since 2019 and am blessed to join you at Holy Trinity Parish as I await my new appointment with JRS after the new year.

In the face of global displacement, Holy Trinity Parish has heeded the Scriptural imperative of responding to the widow, the orphan, and the stranger or refugee—those most vulnerable in our midst. Their welfare was the mark of Covenant fidelity as it is for us today as we at Holy Trinity respond to the Society of Jesus' universal apostolic preferences. Inspired by the heritage of Ignatian discernment, the Jesuit Refugee Service contributes to our common mission of walking with those consigned to the margins of Society, our care for the young and for our common home.

Fr. Pedro Fr. Arrupe (1907–1991), Superior General of the Society of Jesus, founded the Jesuit Refugee Service on Nov. 14, 1980 in response to the plight of Vietnamese refugees. He sought "to bring at least some relief to such a tragic situation" by mobilizing the global resources of the Society of Jesus. It was, he said, "a challenge to the Society we cannot ignore." Over the next decades, JRS would expand and consolidate its mission, responding to civil strife in Central and Latin America, Southeastern Europe, and throughout Africa. JRS has long outgrown its humble beginnings. JRS operates today in 57 countries, serving over a million refugees and other forcibly displaced persons in conflict zones, refugee camps, cities, and detention centers. Post-secondary education and livelihood initiatives promote gender equity, while other programs offer care and inclusive education for children with disabilities, psychosocial support, health care, legal assistance, protection, and humanitarian relief.

In all its programs, JRS promotes social reconciliation through its threefold mission of accompanying refugees and other forcibly displaced persons, serving them, and advocating for justice on their behalf. And the need for such a mission has never been greater. The United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) reports that current levels of displacement are the highest ever recorded. By the end of 2021, an unprecedented 89.3 million people were forced from their homes, including over 36.2 million refugees, asylum seekers, and others displaced across borders, around 40% of whom are under the age of 18. Today, the number of forcibly displaced exceeds 100 million, 60% of whom are internally displaced.

I hope that you will be able to join us as we seek to make the words of Ephesians our own: "we are strangers no longer, but fellow citizens in the household of God" (Eph. 2:19).

Fr. As a member of the team he served in the Kakuma refugee camp in Northwestern Kenya. He will share about his experience in Kenya and the challenges of refugee resettlement.




