For Everyone

At World Youth Day, Pope Francis Appeals for the Church to Welcome All

“There is space in the Church for everyone... Everyone, everyone, everyone!”

Pope Francis encouraged the half-a-million young people who warmly received him on Thursday evening at Lisbon’s Edward VII Park to repeat this word numerous times.

The Pope appeared revitalized and invigorated by the contagious enthusiasm of the girls and boys who, together

with their pastors and educators, traveled to Portugal from all over the world.

“For everyone, para todos,” exclaimed Pope Francis. His message neatly epitomizes the first ten years of his pontificate—a pontificate that began under the banner of mercy.

What does it mean to reiterate that there is room for everyone in the Church?

By way of explanation, the Pope said, “No one is useless; no one is superfluous; there is room for everyone. Just as we are, everyone... ‘But Father, I am a wretch; I am a sinner: is there room for me?’ There is room for everyone.” For, “God loves us; God loves us as we are, not as we wish to be or as society expects us to be: as we are. He loves us with our flaws, limitations, and desires to progress in life. God calls us in this way: have faith because God is a father, and he is a loving father, a father who loves us.”

In a time when everyone gives their opinion and no one listens, when so many try to appear as something they are not, there is no message more attractive and revolutionary than what the Pope is reminding us of: God loves us just as we are, always forgives us, awaits us with open arms, and extends His mercy.

This awareness represents a logic that goes beyond human capacity and reaches the divine, one we learn from the Gospel episode of Zacchaeus, the sinful publican disliked by all in the city of Jericho. Despite the opinions of others about him and feeling curious about the Nazarene prophet, Zacchaeus climbs a sycamore tree and waits for Him to pass, half-hidden among the leaves.

Jesus looks at him first, loves him first, and invites Himself to Zacchaeus’s home, regardless of the scandalized comments from onlookers.

There are no prerequisites to receiving Jesus’ merciful embrace. There are no “instructions” to follow, no preparatory courses to attend, nor techniques to learn.

It is enough to be present when He passes by, surrender to His gaze filled with love and mercy. We need only to remove our barriers and allow Him to embrace us, recognizing Him in the faces of the witnesses He places in our path every day.

The Church has room for everyone, just as it did for Zacchaeus, who had the privilege of hosting the Nazarene at his own table in his own home. His was an unprecedented surprise, a free gift, bestowed purely by grace.

Jesus’ gaze, His call, turned Zacchaeus’s life upside down: because he was loved like never before, he could comprehend the depths of sin and corruption in his existence.

However, conversion for Zacchaeus wasn’t a prerequisite for receiving love and forgiveness.

The dynamic was different: experiencing divine mercy allowed him to realize his own sin and corruption. Experiencing divine mercy made him aware of his status as a poor sinner.

The invitation which the “rejuvenized” Pope Francis reiterated “among the young,” influenced by their enthusiasm, is the key to evangelization today.

What else do we need if not Someone to embrace us as we are, making us feel special, wanted, loved, and forgiven? What else do we need if not to be assured: there is room for you too, regardless of your circumstances? ✝

Pilgrimage to Alabama

January 5-7, 2024 (Parish Coordinator: Ashley Klick)

Since 2020, Holy Trinity parishioners have been exploring the role of slavery, segregation, and race in Holy Trinity's history. Some have been called to gather in racial justice circles to discuss racial healing. Holy Trinity is partnering with Catholic Mobilizing Network to offer this 3-day pilgrimage to Montgomery & Selma. We hope to provide participants the opportunity to further personal formation and to deepen a faith rooted in justice.

Immersion Experience with Maria Madre de los Pobres | January 24-31, 2024 (Parish Coordinator: Margie Legowski)

The primary purpose of this trip is to better understand the reality of life for our brothers and sisters at our sister parish in La Chacra, San Salvador, El Salvador.

Immersion Experience at the Arizona Border

April 5-9, 2024 (Parish Coordinators: Eric Nicoll & Paul Wolfeich)

The Kino Border Initiative has been offering eye-opening, informative, reflective Immersion Experiences. Immersion Experiences allow participants to cross the border to Nogales, Sonora to meet with migrants and asylum seekers, tour our resource center, accompany the Kino team in providing humanitarian services, as well as hike in the desert, converse with ranchers in a rural town in southern Arizona, visit organizations in Tucson, and reflect on legal issues and the immigration system. Immersion Experiences are intended to humanize the immigration issue and to recognize its complexity, while emphasizing accompaniment of migrants on their journey. Over the course of the experience, there are spaces for reflection on the experiences and times to plan follow-up activities and action.

PREFER TO GIVE BY CHECK? THINK CHECKS AVOID CREDIT CARD FEES? READ ON!

It actually costs us more to process a paper check than any electronic donation. Checks (and cash) must be manually handled by staff (three at least: the mail sorter/gift logger, then Finance for the Deposit, then Development to make sure the deposit is credited to a donor record). Then these paper transactions must be reconciled by hand between Development and Finance (this is done automatically with electronic gifts). There is also no way to make an error with an electronic donation so long as the correct donation form is used and the payment is set-up according to the donor's intent. But all these manual transactions for checks make for multiple opportunities for errors, including checks lost or damaged in the mail, bounced checks, illegible checks, incorrectly labeled or unlabeled checks, and incorrectly posted checks, all of which must be dealt with manually and some of which take a great deal of time to fix. Also, electronic donations are processed in near real time whereas the checks are a month behind, due to all this manual handling. So checks actually cost us much more in time and expense - and that's not counting the price of the donation envelopes we send for checks/cash, which is around \$1,500 per quarter. 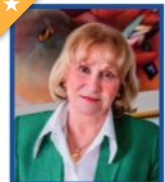
