This weekend, the Church celebrates the third annual World Day For Grandparents And The Elderly. Pope Francis notes, "God wants young people to bring joy to the hearts of the elderly, as Mary did to Elizabeth, and gain wisdom from their experiences."

As we celebrate Grandparents, we asked three generations of one parish family to reflect on how the relationship between grandparents and children helps both to experience God's presence and grow in faith, hope, and love.

Grandmother

We are so filled with gratitude to have been blessed with amazing parents who in turn became amazing grandparents to our son Chris and daughter Megan. children and our kids' grandparents, Pam and Dennis Lucey and Patti and Terry Jack, are an integral part of that village. As we celebrate grandparents, we reflect it was our grandparents who had a distinct role in passing on their faith to us.

We share memories of attending Mass with them as we grew up. The memory of Maw Maw routinely saying the Rosary at home or insisting we arrive two hours early to midnight Mass taught us the importance of prayer and being on time (we are still working on the latter). Grandpa Jim's Irish blessings and holy water by his front door, with pictures of Pope John Paul II and Holy Mary prominently displayed, are also ingrained in our faith.

It's very clear that God's presence is in the relationship between our children and their grandparents. It is present in baking "Baby Jesus' birthday cake," holding hands and praying before meals, worshipping together in the same pew on Sundays, and family prayer before we travel separate ways.

Our Catholic faith is at the heart of who we are as a family and the choice to raise our children to be people for others. The special relationship encourages them to grow in faith, hope, and love.

From Megan Rounsaville (daughter of Pam, mother to Lucey and Johnny):

What a blessing to be able to live in the same area as my family. I cherish the times we spend together in each other's homes, on vacations, at our kids' sporting events, and especially each week at Mass.

Watching my children grow in their faith alongside their cousins, aunt and uncle, and especially my parents is not something I take for granted. My kids have created unique, spectacular relationships with their grandparents. They share inside jokes, special stories, and thoughtful reflections. They also share a beautiful love of the Lord.

I was blessed to grow up in Holy Trinity's incredible faith community and give thanks that my children are able to do the same, hand-in-hand with their grandparents.

Grandchildren

Jack (Age 11) – *"I enjoy going on vacation with our family and having Daddo take us to the local church to say three 'good wishes' (i.e. prayers). I say prayers for the poor, my family, and soccer."*

Charlotte (Age 7) – *"My grandparents are always there for me, just like God's love. My family tell me when I sing at Mass I pray twice. I once asked Nana, 'why do they talk about CVS pharmacy in that song?' Turns out that song (Ubi Caritas) has a line (Deus ibi est) that sounds like CVS. We always have a little giggle every time we sing it."*

Lucey (Age 11) – *"I've always loved going to mass with my grandparents because it really celebrates both of our generations and love of Jesus. I have many great memories of going to mass with my family but one favorite memory is when I was about seven years old. I got to sit with the choir and sing with my grandma. My little brother sat with my grandfather in the first pew and sang along with us. I will always remember this moment because I felt God's love all around me."*

Johnny (age 8) – *"My favorite part of mass is the kiss of peace. I love hugging my Daddo and blowing my Nana kisses and giving her the peace sign and 'I love you' sign."*

SEASON OF CREATION: POPE FRANCIS TO RELEASE LAUDATO SI' 2.0

Pope Francis said Wednesday he will be releasing an update to his landmark 2015 environmental encyclical on Oct. 4, the feast of his nature-loving namesake, St. Francis of Assisi, as he called for an end to the "senseless war against our common home."

Francis recently revealed he was writing a "second part" to the document "to address current problems." The Vatican spokesman said the update would take into account in particular recent climate crises.

Francis has rebuked "obstructionist" climate doubters and accused politicians of listening more to oil industry interests than Scripture, common sense or the cries of the poor.

On Wednesday, Francis told his weekly general audience that he intended to publish the update on Oct. 4, the feast of St. Francis and also the start of Francis' big Vatican meeting on the future of the Catholic Church.

Ken Boretti and Carl Reid grew up in different worlds. Ken, a cradle Catholic, is of Irish and Italian descent and hails from Beverly, Massachusetts. Carl is African American and was the product of the military community which was integrated by President Truman’s Executive Order 9981 in 1948. FROM KATE DEVLIN, ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL OF HOLY TRINITY SCHOOL

My Nana, Mary Pickitt, is hands down the Catholic matriarch of our family. She’s someone who has talked about and displayed her own faith proudly (yet, honestly), and it inspired me to do the same.

Nana’s devout faith attracts those with similar natures into her life. I grew up being one of the few children attending Easter mass at the Sisters of Mercy convent in Belmont, NC, because one of Nana’s best friends was a Sister there. Because of these experiences, I was exposed to even more women who impressed me with their devotion, committing their lives to a service unlike many in today’s world.

There’s a running line in our family that “Nana’s answer is always yes.” To me, this means that yes, she’s always praying for you; yes, she’ll donate to that organization you really believe in; yes, she’ll dig deep in conversation about your faith and how hers has evolved over the last 88 years.

Mary Kathryn Pickitt is my namesake, but she’s also much of the reason that I have taught at a Catholic school these past ten years and have a soft spot for saying the Rosary. If faith has a ripple effect, then I smile when I think about what an impact hers has had on so many throughout the years.
