CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

Proclaiming the Good News with Love and Joy

On the third Sunday of September, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Catechetical Sunday. Through this celebration, we recognize those in our parish who are catechists and to reflect on the meaning of catechesis, a ministry to which all of us are called generally and some are called more specifically. This year the United States Catholic Bishops have adopted the scripture verse: “Come to me all you who labor and are burdened” (Mt 11:28) as the theme for the catechetical year. As we welcomed over

540 children and teens from 275 families last Sunday to the start of faith formation this year, I must admit that I had little sense of a burdened community! Instead, I experienced much joy and eagerness among both catechists and families to begin anew our year together.

Bob, a new catechist, shared the following: “My first day as a catechist was very refreshing. All the students were excited to participate. We even discovered that we have a geography/history expert in our 3rd grade class who was eager to recite some facts while we sat on the classroom rug with the USA map.”

Kathleen, a veteran catechist, reflected: “I’ve had many first days of RE, but every one comes with the excitement of seeing something all-new, full of possibilities and hope. We talked about our names when we took attendance, and I explained to the class that God called them by their name at baptism into a life with Him. It might have been my imagination, but it seemed like everyone sat up a little straighter upon hearing that.”

I believe this excitement flows from our gathering together to celebrate our life in Jesus Christ and to enter a place where we encounter God through word, one another, sacrament, and service and justice. We know that around

us many are burdened, our world is weary, and the earth cries out for healing. In our own lives we labor in the face of personal and family struggles. Yet the encounter with the living God through the community we call Church gives us hope. In this we realize the Church's mission to evangelize and the role of catechesis in furthering this mission.

Catechesis, or an “echoing” of the faith—a passing on to others of what we know, believe, and live—further evangelization. Evangelization “is the carrying forth of the Good News to all sectors of the human race, so that by its strength it may enter into the hearts of humankind and renew the human race.” (*General Directory for Catechesis*, 46) It begins with proclaiming the Good News both in word and in action. Pope Francis beautifully sums up the Good News: “Jesus Christ loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you.” (*Joy of the Gospel*, 164) Thus, our catechesis rests on love, drawing those we teach into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. It requires that we love those we catechize. While at times challenging, the reality that many of our catechists return each year to teach the same grade is an expression of this love. Nadine, a 7th grade catechist, joked that she “hasn’t made it past 7th grade!” It was clear through the joy in her voice that she delights in returning to accompany these young people each year.

As catechists accompany those they teach, they offer ways to open hearts to the presence of the Holy Spirit and in turn to learn how to recognize God's loving presence in their lives. One kindergarten catechist uses the idea of light when praying the Examen with her class. Each week she gives children a chance to answer the question, “Where did your light shine?” Parents, whose children are enrolled in At Home Catechesis, talk about God as they live out their day-to-day activities, and together they awaken to God's presence through nature, in their family, and among their friends.

Adults on our team for the Rite of Christian Initiation and youth ministry volunteers also accompany those

who are seeking to know God and help them to understand what it means to live as a follower of Jesus Christ in the Catholic tradition. RCIA meets weekly throughout the year and currently has 25 parishioners at various stages along the process; and 22 high school teens attended the Sunday youth group last weekend.

To conclude, Pilar, another veteran catechist, writes: “Each faith formation class is like an Easter Sunday. Serving as catechist is a joyful ministry and is not a matter of your own will, it is God's invitation, and you respond yes.” May we give thanks to those who have responded “yes,” and renew our commitment to bring the Good News with joy and love to those in our parish, our community, and world through the ministry of catechesis. ✠

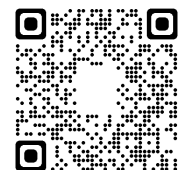
**A SACRED SPACE OF FINAL REPOSE**

SEASON OF CREATION ECO EXAMEN EVENT

September 17 | 10:15-11:00 AM, Chapel

As part of the Season of Creation, join the Green Team for a prayerful reflection on your personal relationship with creation. We will experience a guided Examen prayer to listen to how God is inviting us as individuals and as a parish community to care for creation and the most vulnerable.

An overview of the Examen:

1. I give thanks to God for creation and for being wonderfully made. Where did I feel God's presence in creation today?
2. I ask for the grace to see creation as God does – in all its splendor and suffering. Do I see the beauty of creation and hear the cries of the earth and the poor?
3. I ask for the grace to look closely to see how my life choices impact creation and the poor and vulnerable. What challenges or joys do I experience as I recall my care for creation? How can I turn away from a throwaway culture and instead stand in solidarity with creation and the poor?
4. I ask for the grace of conversion towards ecological justice and reconciliation. Where have I fallen short in caring for creation and my brothers and sisters? How do I ask for a conversion of heart?
5. I ask for the grace to reconcile my relationship with God, creation and humanity, and to stand in solidarity through my actions. How can I repair my relationship with creation and make choices consistent with my desire for reconciliation with creation?
6. I offer a closing prayer for the earth and the vulnerable in our society.

CELEBRATING CATHOLIC WOMEN IN OUR LIVES

As part of our celebration of St. Phoebe in September, we invited parishioners to share a story of a Catholic woman who has made a profound impact on their faith and how they live it out.

FROM JANE MCAULIFFE:

Less than a hundred yards from Holy Trinity lives one of the most saintly women I know. Of course, like most saints, she would bristle at the description and waste no time denying it. Sister Mary Berchmans Hannan, president emerita of Georgetown Visitation, has served the school for more than seven decades as a teacher, an academic administrator, a monastery leader, and a spiritual guide.



In 1993, after a devastating fire gutted the school’s historic building, she spearheaded a stunning restoration that renewed the spirits of the entire Visitation community. In recent years, she has strengthened Visitation’s identity as a center of Salesian spirituality, securing its spiritual foundation for the generations to come. Most importantly, she has shaped the lives of countless students, continuing to advise and counsel many of them long into adulthood, while embodying a selfless model of servant leadership.

Through all her activities and achievements, Sister Mary Berchmans has lived the virtues with which Saint Francis de Sales and Saint Jane Francis de Chantal imbued their order, the quiet virtues of humility, kindness, patience, simplicity, courage, acceptance and – my favorite – joyful optimism.

My friend, Lauren Harper, recently moved to Rome to pursue religious life with the Missionary Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo.

Over the past two years of knowing her, I witnessed how she welcomed people with radical hospitality, inviting countless new people into her home for meals.

She shares her faith authentically and without judgment, always leaving room for the Holy Spirit to transform hearts. Her commitment to serving God through those put into her care is inspiring.

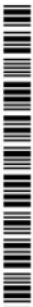

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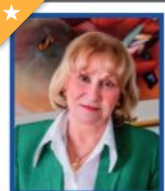
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
