FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It is hard to believe that this week marks the 8th anniversary of my arrival at Holy Trinity to serve as your pastor. As I begin my 9th year, I continue to be amazed and grateful for the many engaged parishioners who provide a plethora of programs and services. Allow me to list some of the recent happenings.

Over the summer, we welcomed a new Principal at Holy Trinity School, Katy Williams. Katy has a long commitment to Catholic education and is already proving to be a tremendous leader for the parish school. We were also pleased to welcome a new Communications Director, Ted Newton. Ted and his wife are longtime parishioners, and their two children were baptized at Holy Trinity.

Also over the summer, a Strategic Planning Committee began to meet so as to develop a vision for the parish's next 3-5 years. Facilitated by Matt Shank, this committee includes Stephen Aubin, John Byrnes, Maury Devine, Stephanie Fiesta, Chris Gaston, Catherine Heinhold,

Fr. Bill Kelley, Clarion Johnson, Gail Louis, Katy Dunn Williams, and me. Within the next month we hope to announce to the parish community a vision statement from which we hope to launch a feasibility study for a possible campaign.

Several Sundays ago, we had our annual Ministry Fair with more than 20 tables representing an array of ministries. That same Sunday, our Religious Education Program began with more than 500 children ranging from kindergarten to 8th grade launching another year in their Catholic religious formation.

I should also note that recently our worship committee met for more than two hours discussing our liturgical worship. The committee represents the diversity of our parish with parishioners from various liturgical roles, long-term and newer parishioners, those who participate regularly in the different Mass times of the parish, young adults, older adults, and middle-aged adults. Meanwhile our Parish Pastoral Council had a vibrant meeting two weeks ago. A photo of these 12 engaged leaders appears below. Parishioners are welcome to attend the monthly meetings in person or via Zoom.



Beginning last week, more than 50 parishioners began participating in small faith-sharing groups. They'll reflect on the Sunday readings and share with each other how those readings touch on their own lives. Opportunities to share their spiritual consolations and desolations help group members to grow in discernment and in community with one another.

On October 4th, the next phase of the Synod process begins in Rome when several hundred bishops and laity meet in Rome to discern the salient issues facing the Catholic Church today. One of our parishioners, Mr. Richard Coll, will be attending as a voting member. A former member of our Parish Council and an administrator with the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops, Richard is well qualified to listen and respond to the synodal processes.

He has kindly agreed upon his return to speak to the parish.

As a way of participating in the synodal process right here at home, this Sunday at the 5:30 Mass, Ms. Marie Djouadi and I will have a shared reflection on the Sunday readings. This collaboration will continue a series of lay-presider experimental reflections, which have been approved by Cardinal Gregory.

Finally, I would be remiss if I failed to mention and express my gratitude to my Administrative Assistants, Lisa Dittmeier and Helene Flanagan. They both will be retiring this fall. Lisa for the past eight years and Helene for the past four years have brought their own great gifts to the position. Please let me know if you know of someone who would be interested in serving as my executive assistant. He or she would be able to share with me the amazement I have for this faith community named after the Holy Trinity. ✚

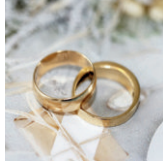

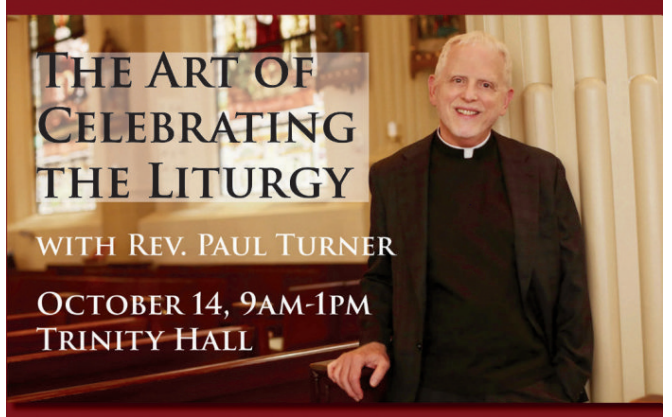

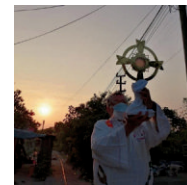
