Parishioner Melissa Thierry shares her family's experience with Shepherd's Flock:

I am honored to share with you, during this Respect Life Month, my family's experience with Shepherd's Flock. My family joined Holy Trinity in the summer of 2021 after hearing about this program that focuses on children and young people with special needs and their families. Students who participate in Shepherd's Flock may have learning challenges, be on the autism spectrum, or have Down syndrome or other genetic disorders.

We have two children, and our oldest, Julia, has Down syndrome. In addition to all the academic, social and societal considerations that we navigate on a daily basis

while rearing a child with special needs, finding an appropriate and inclusive environment to nourish faith formation was extremely important to us, not only for our daughter, but for our entire family. This is the beauty of Holy Trinity and the Shepherd's Flock Program. It embraces not only the student, but the entire family – and the whole congregation.

Shepherd's Flock uses the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd model, teaching in an "atrium" environment to create a meaningful experience for the children. This model offers lessons and curriculum to support children as they experience the "sacred" in a hands-on manner. Luci Cedrone and other trained catechists combine, innovate and adapt these various resources to meet the needs of students. They also use the multifaceted Loyola Press curriculum designed especially for use with children with special needs, The Finding God Adaptive Program.

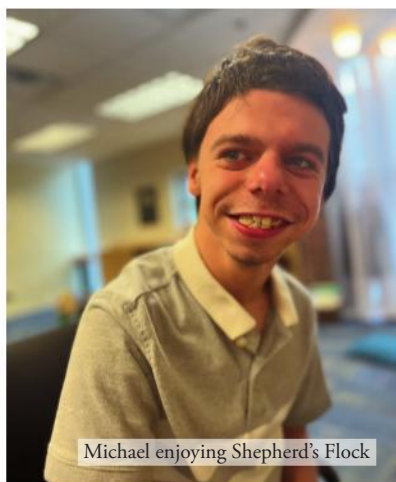
Julia has grown and flourished in her faith while attending Shepherd's Flock. She worked and prepared for First Holy Communion, and we are thrilled that she will participate in this sacrament alongside her younger brother in the spring. Father Kevin and others know her by name, look her in the eye and speak to her like any other parishioner. She sees other kids who are like her, and I get to visit with families who are like my family. I look forward to Julia singing with the children's choir someday, if that is something she would like to do.

Shepherd's Flock is so much more than a religious education class – it is a feeling, a way of being. It is a ministry by and with those with special needs – not just for people with special needs. Our family has found at Holy Trinity a spiritual environment that is inclusive and welcoming to all, a space where a program like Shepherd's Flock is important to not only the students and families involved, but to other parishioners and church leadership. It is a true inclusive ministry.

Parishioner Lara Walt shares her family's experience with Shepherd's Flock:

Our son sees and reacts to the world around him in unique ways. At Holy Trinity, we have found a community that respects and embraces him. Through Shepherd's Flock classes, our son has been able to experience God through lessons that are adapted to his way of understanding the world.

At the monthly Shepherd's Flock Mass and potluck, we can share faith and community in a Mass that reaches our children where they are. The potluck provides an opportunity to share faith and stories about the challenges and joys

of having people with special needs in our families. The Trinity Hall Mass is sensory-friendly and allows our son to participate more fully in Mass, especially through music.

We feel so blessed to have found a community that welcomes our family and works with our family so that all of us can be more connected to the wider parish community.

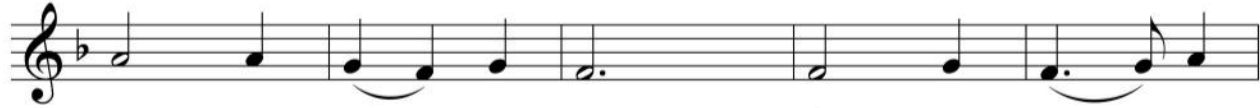

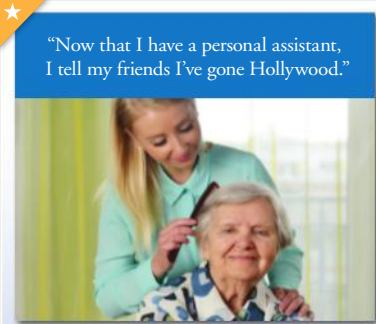

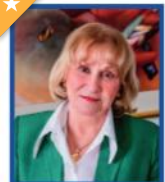
