This past Spring, Ashley Klick produced a one-page graphic (*at right*) on the impact of our social justice ministry. “Unparalleled,” “Striking,” and “Remarkable” are three impressions that immediately came to mind as I looked it over. Throughout my nearly 30-year career in the Christian Church, my one desire and objective has been to support ministries that change lives for the better, in the here-and-now. Ashley’s graphic was a vivid portrayal of one way our parish does exactly that. If you haven’t seen it, here it is; or check out the 2023 tithe fund recipients online at bit.ly/47pUYDb.

As powerful as this graphic is, our Social Justice work represents – incredibly – only one way in which you, the people of Holy Trinity, transform lives for the better. I do not believe I have ever seen a parish that takes more seriously, and lives out more fully, its mission statement: We are a Jesuit parish that welcomes all to: Accompany One Another in Christ, Celebrate God’s Love and Transform Lives.

A GROWING TECHNOCRATIC PARADIGM An excerpt from Pope Francis’ *Laudate Deum*

“... In *Laudato Si*’, I offered a brief resumé of the technocratic paradigm underlying the current process of environmental decay. It is “a certain way of understanding human life and activity [that] has gone awry, to the serious detriment of the world around us.” Deep down, it consists in thinking “as if reality, goodness and truth automatically flow from technological and economic power as such.” As a logical consequence, it then becomes easy “to accept the idea of infinite or unlimited growth, which proves so attractive to economists, financiers and experts in technology.”

Artificial intelligence and the latest technological innovations start with the notion of a human being with no limits, whose abilities and possibilities can be infinitely expanded thanks to technology. In this way, the technocratic paradigm monstrously feeds upon itself.

Without a doubt, the natural resources required by technology, such as lithium, silicon and so many others, are not unlimited, yet the greater problem is the ideology underlying an obsession: to increase human power beyond anything imaginable, before which nonhuman reality is a mere resource at its disposal. Everything that exists ceases to be a gift for which we should be thankful, esteem and cherish, and instead becomes a slave, prey to any whim of the human mind and its capacities.

It is chilling to realize that the capacities expanded by technology “have given those with the knowledge and especially the economic resources to use them, an impressive dominance over the whole of humanity and the entire world. Never has humanity had such power over itself, yet nothing ensures that it will be used wisely, particularly when we consider how it is currently being used...”
