**Inspiring And Re-Energizing**  
*The Ignatian Family Teach-In for Justice*

The Ignatian Family Teach-In for Justice is an annual conference put on by the Ignatian Solidarity Network. Holy Trinity has been a sponsor for years and continues to send a sizable delegation. This year, 39 people attended the conference, including 21 students from four different high schools and 18 adults, many of whom participated in the Parish Track of the conference. This event brings Jesuit institutions from across the country together to remember the Salvadoran martyrs of 1989 and learn about social justice through the lens of the Catholic faith. Students have the option to advocate on Capitol Hill as well, meeting with representatives in Congress to talk about migration

and climate policy. Below, student and adult participants share some insights from their experience.

***From a high school junior:***

“I attended the Ignatian Family Teach-in for Justice with several students from Visitation and Elizabeth Seton High Schools and almost 2000 other attendees. Throughout the conference, I heard many speakers and attended many breakout sessions about issues like the Jesuits’ role in the slave trade, gun violence, the death penalty, modern segregation in schools, women’s roles in the church and more. I loved hearing other young church members talk about issues they found important. I met many high school students from Arizona to Wisconsin, and from New York to here in DC. And finally on Monday, the Advocacy Day, I joined a group of students to meet with senators and representatives to talk about issues of migration and climate change. We met with members of Senator Tim Kaine’s staff for about half an hour, and it was very exciting to have an experience like this.”

***From a high school junior:***

“I found it incredibly rewarding to see service in action. Being able to directly meet with representatives to discuss what we learned at the conference was surreal. Directly taking Catholic social teachings and relating them to the

world around us was an effective way to understand the world and the issues we as a Church face together.”

**From a high school junior:**

“I was able to hear from other perspectives while growing in my faith and hearing from a Catholic perspective. Advocacy Day taught me how to lobby Congress for issues I care about and inspired me to take action.”

**From a Parish Track participant:**

“I enjoyed getting to know people from other parishes who are as concerned and committed to Social Justice as Holy Trinity. It’s good to know there are many others with us on this journey to justice.”

**From a Parish Track participant:**

“I brought two Salvadoran friends awaiting residency in the U.S. to the session on Shaping a Just Future: El Salvador, Migration and Advocacy, presented by Odette Bonilla, an economics major at the University of Central America (UCA). My friend’s family suffered greatly from the gang violence, literally fled for their lives, and were conflicted about concern for human rights of incarcerated gang members. However, she was hope-filled after hearing the balanced, reasonable approach of this young economist. Thank you for including us in the Trinity group at the Ignatian Family Teach-In.”

**From Chris Malano, CSP:**

“During the parish networking lunch, I was inspired by the conversation we had about empowering young people toward leadership in the Church, while also equipping them with appropriate resources and opportunities. Developing leadership skills is a process, we should not expect young people to somehow leapfrog into being skilled leaders.”

From these testimonies, we can see that the conference offers meaningful experiences for high school students learning about these issues for the first time and adults who have been pursuing justice work as part of the parish for decades. I hope you will consider joining the delegation for next year’s conference in Fall 2024.

**THE WEAKNESS OF INTERNATIONAL POLITICS**  
**An excerpt from Pope Francis’ *Laudate Deum***

“... I invite you to recognize that ‘many groups and organizations within civil society help to compensate for the shortcomings of the international community, its lack of coordination in complex situations, and its lack of attention to fundamental human rights.’ For example, the Ottawa Process against the use, production and manufacture of antipersonnel mines is one example that shows how civil society with its organizations is capable of creating effective dynamics that the United Nations cannot. ...

In the medium-term, globalization favours spontaneous cultural interchanges, greater mutual knowledge and processes of integration of peoples, which end up provoking a multilateralism ‘from below’ and not simply one determined by the elites of power. The demands that rise up from below throughout the world, where activists from very different countries help and support one another, can end up pressuring the sources of power. It is to be hoped that this will happen with respect to the climate crisis. ...

Postmodern culture has generated a new sensitivity towards the more vulnerable and less powerful. This is connected with my insistence in the Encyclical Letter *Fratelli Tutti* on the primacy of the human person and the defence of his or her dignity beyond every circumstance. It is another way of encouraging multilateralism for the sake of resolving the real problems of humanity, securing before all else respect for the dignity of persons, in such a way that ethics will prevail over local or contingent interests.

It is not a matter of replacing politics, but of recognizing that the emerging forces are becoming increasingly relevant and are in fact capable of obtaining important results in the resolution of concrete problems, as some of them demonstrated during the pandemic. ...”
