Let The Children Come To Me

Mass From A Toddler Mom's Perspective

There was a time when Sunday Mass was a contemplative act for me. I would get to church early, take some time to say my intentions or meditate, before embarking on the ritual of Mass. That feels so far away now, thanks to the addition of one very cute and very active toddler that calls me momma.

Now, Sunday Mass feels like a race. One run with the aid of coloring books (Bible story themed, at least!), Spider-Man stickers (how do we know he's not Catholic?), and snacks, so many snacks. And all of this in an attempt to get through Mass without disturbing the ritual for those around me. Sometimes I walk out exhausted after just an hour.

There have been times that my husband and I have talked about finding another Church, one with a cry room tucked somewhere out of the way. Each time we reject that idea, because Holy Trinity is special, and it is our community. This is where we met, this is where we married, and this is the community of faith that has nurtured us. We want our son to know this place as we have and experience the sacredness of this community as he grows.



On particularly challenging days, I remind myself of Mathew 19:14 when Jesus says, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them..." I like that Jesus doesn't say, "Let the well-behaved children come to me." He just says let the children come, and I remind myself that my son is welcome in Jesus' house. That he's allowed to take up space here. Jesus wants him here!

I've also been profoundly grateful to our community for

their kindness to my family, and I'm sure so many other families with small children. Whether it is ushers pulling Bible-themed picture books out of seemingly nowhere, the children's Mass with the Homily populated by stuffed animals, or parishioners stopping us after Mass to say how cute my son is or that they are glad we're here – it means a lot to my family and to me.

One Sunday, a kind mother of a teenager spent much of Mass receiving crayons, toy cars, and stickers from my son. He thus stayed quiet in the pew for most of the Mass. It was a rare gift. I thanked her after Mass with tears in my eyes and promised myself that one day I'd return the favor to another young family.

I know that this time is short. There will be days ahead when Mass is not running around the back of church, but quiet and contemplative again. Until then, I want to thank our community for their kindness to our young families.

CLIMATE CONFERENCES: PROGRESS AND FAILURES

An excerpt from Pope Francis' *Laudate Deum*

“For several decades now, representatives of more than 190 countries have met periodically to address the issue of climate change. The 1992 Rio de Janeiro Conference led to the adoption of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), a treaty that took effect when the necessary ratification on the part of the signatories concluded in 1994. These States meet annually in the Conference of the Parties (COP), the highest decision-making body. Some of these Conferences were failures, like that of Copenhagen (2009), while others made it possible to take important steps forward, like COP3 in Kyoto (1997). ...

COP21 in Paris (2015) represented another significant moment, since it generated an agreement that involved everyone. It can be considered as a new beginning, given the failure to meet the goals previously set. The agreement took effect on 4 November 2016. Albeit a binding agreement, not all its dispositions are obligations in the strict sense, and some of them leave ample room for discretion. In any case, properly speaking, there are no provisions for sanctions in the case of unfulfilled commitments, nor effective instruments to ensure their fulfilment. It also provides for a certain flexibility in the case of developing countries. ...

Today we can continue to state that, ‘the accords have been poorly implemented, due to lack of suitable mechanisms for oversight, periodic review and penalties in cases of noncompliance. The principles which they proclaimed still await an efficient and flexible means of practical implementation.’ Also, that ‘international negotiations cannot make significant progress due to positions taken by countries which place their national interests above the global common good. Those who will have to suffer the consequences of what we are trying to hide will not forget this failure of conscience and responsibility.’ ...”

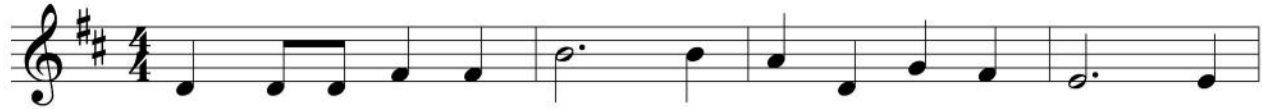

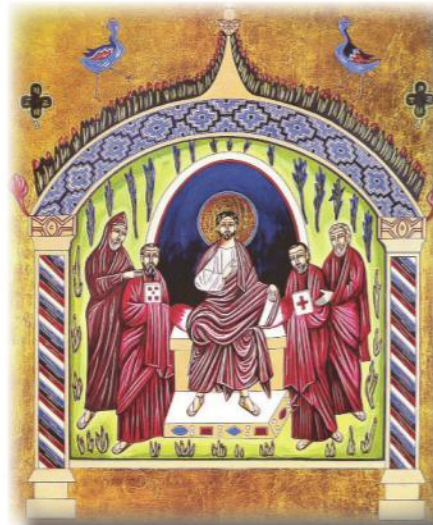

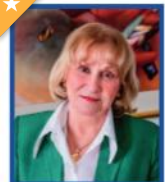
