## *Second Sunday of Advent*

### **A Pilgrim's Journey** *by Kathleen Bashian*

A tourist travels seeking adventure, escape, or maybe even bragging rights. A pilgrim journeys in search of something different — a spiritual journey, richly laden with mystery and surprise. The call to travel might be the compelling testimony of another or an internal quickening which beckons, and we somehow know this travel is right.

Once we committed to a pilgrimage, the journey had already begun. Our pilgrim group knows this from experience as we traveled to Turkey and Greece. Under Fr. Ben Hawley's pastoral care and guidance, we began our preparation through monthly meetings, readings, and prayer. We explored such subjects as Eastern Orthodox Mysticism, Desert Prayer, Icons, Turkish history, and Pauline theology. Fr. Ben introduced us to the Jesus Prayer, and this became a regular with us: "Lord Jesus Christ,



Son of the living God, have mercy on me." It became the leitmotif for the pilgrimage, and I continue this practice upon my return.

A pilgrim group differs from a tourist group in other ways; a pilgrim group is generally more forgiving of the common

everyday foibles of humanity—the latecomer, the slow mover, or the puzzling questioner of what seems to be obvious. Pilgrims are generally more tolerant of inevitable interruptions, cancellations, or delays. A group that prays together seems to be more compassionate with one another, knowing that God is working on the rough edges in each of us.

Fr. Ben asked us to complete a form in advance about our expectations for the journey. Upon our return he asked us to revisit that document (typical Ignatian practice) and compare the expectation with the aftermath. I expected to learn more about St. Paul and to deep dive into Pauline theology. Instead, I had a profound experience at Patmos and a call to wrestle with St. John’s purported text of Revelation. The experience of Christian Orthodox Spirituality, praying with icons, has also given me new insight into Visio Divina. Western Christians will marvel at the aesthetic beauty of a painting which mirrors a religious theme. For Orthodox Easterners, an icon is a window to delve deeper into the divine. The icon itself is considered sacred, and Easterners will kiss this sacred object with reverence and awe.

We visited the home of Mary in Ephesus, if indeed she lived there. The real happening occurred outside of the home when Fr. Ben invited us to unite our own lives with the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. We all receive Annunciations that are puzzling and fearsome. We need to ponder them in our hearts and then go on Visitation to have them questioned or confirmed. We can then expect to experience a Nativity of new life, which we must Present to God with thanksgiving and to our world. Although we might lose sight of our calling and become Lost in the Temple, we can be assured that we will find our way once again, just as Jesus was lost to his parents, but found once again teaching in the temple.

While visiting the Hagia Sophia in Istanbul, I learned how this sacred place has been transformed over the centuries. In the 4th century, Constantine commissioned a church on this site on the foundations of a pagan temple. That church was destroyed and rebuilt until in the 6th century the Byzantine Emperor

Justinian I replaced it with this present building. When the Turks conquered the Byzantine empire in 1453, they converted it into a mosque. In 1934 the building became a museum, and in 2020 it was converted into a mosque once again. This marvelous architectural wonder witnesses to how Almighty God is enduringly praised through the ages in many denominational forms, be they pagan, Christian or Muslim. The Divine spark engenders remarkable works of art that know no boundaries.

A pilgrim feels a sense of privilege and responsibility imposed by the blessings of pilgrimage, and there is a whispered mandate –“To whom much is given, much is expected.” Each of us is discerning the aftercall of our spiritual journey. We are gathering once again to discuss this call and to support each other in our endeavors. A bond of fellowship was forged on our journey which will hopefully endure and intensify as we go forth to wherever the Lord may lead us.
