Fourth Sunday of Advent

Jesus Christ and the Joy of Christmas in India

Fr. John has been a visiting professor and Jesuit Chair at Georgetown University this past semester, residing in Holy Trinity's rectory. He has presided at numerous Masses here at Trinity, and has been a most welcome guest. He is heading back to India, and shares this piece on the celebration of Christmas in his home country:

Dear Holy Trinity Parishioners,

I wish you all a Blessed Christmas and Hope-filled New Year 2024!

Allow me to share a few thoughts on the joy of Christmas in India and who do the Indians say Jesus Christ is? India is an incredible land filled with religions, cultures, poor, contradictions and complexities. It is the birth place to religions like; Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism, Sikhism,

faith traditions of oppressed people Dalits and Adivasis. The religion of Islam found favor on Indian soil. Saints Thomas and Bartholomew, preached the Gospel and formed Christian communities in India. In 1542, Saint Francis Xavier reached Goa and paved the way for Jesuit missions.

Christmas is a time of family gathering, celebration and worship. It is a time for cakes and carols, Santa clauses and shopping. Students and teachers from Christian educational institutions, formation centers and the laity from parishes organize spiritual/cultural/charitable activities in the interreligious centers, homes for the aged, Mother Teresa Homes, Shelter Homes for Migrants, Slums and Prisons.

Christmas is celebrated not only by Christians but also people of other faiths. In India, we are accustomed to the worship of Child gods/goddesses: Krishna, Murugan,

Ayyappa, Durga, and Batukamma. The large number of lullabies sung at Christmas time in Indian languages is a sign of ‘inculturation’ into this tradition.

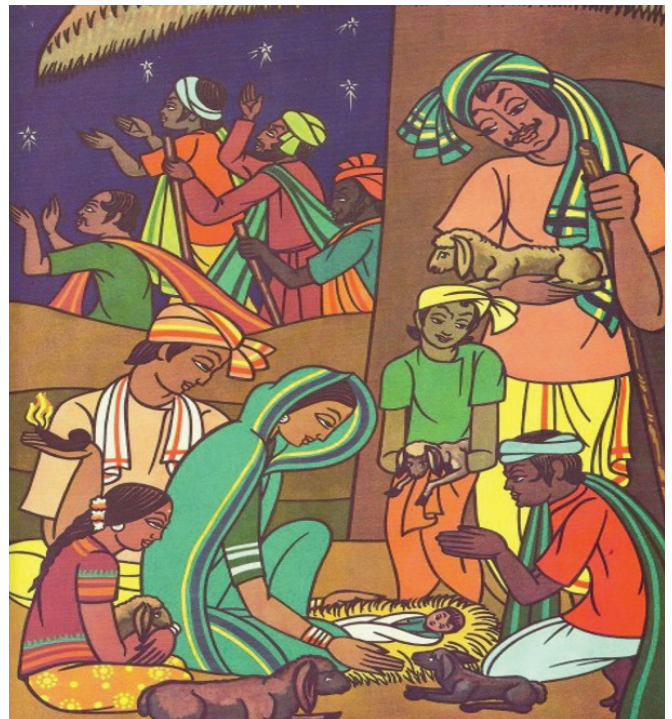
An Italian Jesuit, Joseph Constantine Beschi (1680-1747), a missionary theologian, in his work *Thembavani* (the unfading garland), an epic poem in Tamil language, in honor of St Joseph makes the Father sing a lullaby to Baby Jesus:

The Abode of mercy, the ocean of joy, I am blessed to see you sleeping
For the heart that is wounded, you are a remedy incomparable o grace-filled love ... (10:138)
You have come as a Satguru [True Teacher], why do you hide yourself?
You are the bright sun to destroy the darkness of evil, why don't you shine?
You are born to bring joy to the world, a joy that is heavenly.
You who deserved unremitting love, O Treasure Supreme,
Such a great mercy must be seen by both the eyes and enjoyed (10:148).

Who do the Indians say Jesus Christ is?

In 19th century, the enlightened Hindus like; Raja Ram Mohan Roy encountered Jesus as a Supreme Guide to Human Happiness, Swami Ramakrishna Paramahansa had the vision of Mother Mary holding the Child Jesus. Swami Vivekananda the founder of Ramakrishna Mission, spoke of Jesus as Liberator. Paramahansa Yogananda who lived thirty-two years in America, presented Jesus, the Lord of Yoga. Pandita Ramabai a convert to the Anglican Church, travelled extensively North America, argued for ‘Counter-cultural Jesus’, for the emancipation of women in India.

In 20th century, Mahatma Gandhi was inspired by the ‘Sermon on the Mount’ and considered Jesus, the Supreme Satyagrahi (Beholder of Truth). A Belgian Missionary Constant Livens and his companions converted the tribals in Jharkhand, and gave them the image of Jesus, the Param Adivasi (the Ancient One).



Gurram Joshua presented Jesus, the Dalit. Satya Sai Baba spoke of Jesus, the Embodiment of Love.


The Indians cutting across the religions, have developed a special devotion to Jesus Christ. He speaks to them in their own idiom. There are many books along this direction: *Oriental Christ*, *The Unknown Christ of Hinduism*, *The Yoga of Jesus*, *The Child and the Serpent*, *Asian Faces of Jesus*, *Asian Jesus*, *Jesus in Asia*, *Jesus of Asian Women*, *Jesus in Kashmir*, *Indian Faces of Jesus*, etc...

Indians also depict Jesus Christ in their architecture, art and painting. I draw your attention to a painting of Nativity (see above) by Sr. Marie Claire SMMI (1937-2018). She was a Hindu convert from Tirupati, a well-known Temple city in South India. Sr. Claire used in her paintings Indian rural dress, codes and symbols.

To end, my sincere thanks to Frs. Kevin Gillespie, Patrick Earl, Benjamin Hawley, William Kelly, the Holy Trinity Staff and Parishioners for your hospitality and prayers. I cherished prayerful moments in the chapel of St. Ignatius of Loyola and the interaction with Saturday’s Coffee Club.

PRAY FOR OUR PILGRIMS

From **January 5 to 7, 2024**, parishioners will participate in a Pilgrimage to Montgomery and Selma, Alabama, organized by Holy Trinity Social Justice Ministry and Catholic Mobilizing Network. Since 2020, Holy Trinity parishioners have been exploring the role of slavery, segregation, and race in Holy Trinity's history, and praying and reflecting on the complicity with racial injustice and the work towards racial healing. 25 parishioners will travel to Alabama to witness landmarks of racial violence and resilience, learn about the Civil Rights movement's history and present, pray together, and discern how God is calling us to dismantle racism within our lives, ministries, social systems and Church. 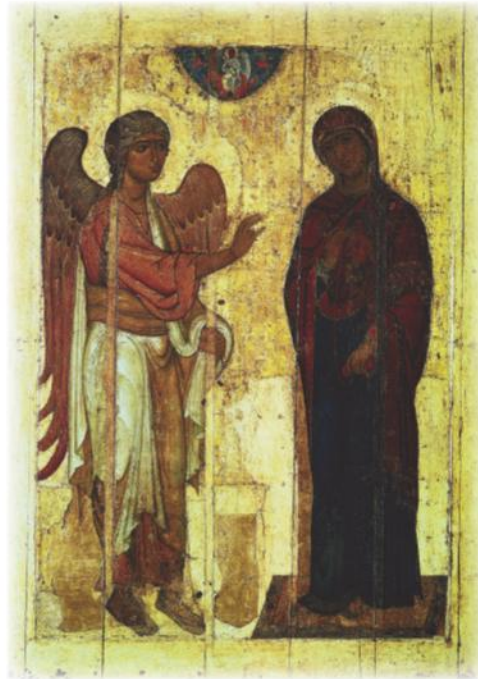
